Dr. Peter Sebeny is a board-certified Internal Medicine and Infectious Diseases physician. Currently, he works at Parkland Medical Center in Derry, and Anna Jaques Hospital in Newburyport. In the last 6 years, he has also worked at Portsmouth Regional Hospital. He currently is the Director of Infectious Disease Services and plays an active role with Infection Prevention and Antimicrobial Stewardship Committees at Parkland Medical Center and Anna Jaques Hospital (an affiliate of Beth Israel – Lahey Health).

He attended medical school at the George Washington University in Washington, DC, where he also previously received an MPH in Epidemiology. He completed residency and fellowship at the National Capital Consortium in Washington, through the National Naval Medical Center and Walter Reed Army Medical Center, as well as other academic medical centers in the DC area. Prior to relocating to the Seacoast of New Hampshire, he most recently served as a Medical Corps officer in the US Navy and as a clinician educator as an Assistant Professor of Medicine at the Uniformed Services University School of Medicine in Bethesda, MD. Dr. Sebeny also has extensive epidemiological and clinical research experience, and led numerous infectious disease research projects in the United States at the Naval Medical Research Center in Silver Spring, MD and with collaborators in Egypt, Africa, and the Middle East/Southwest Asia while at Naval Medical Research Unit Number 3 in Cairo, Egypt. He served on several expert committees on infectious diseases research priorities and authored many clinical research publications.

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
